## The Story of Our Constitution

- 1) After independence, each colony became an independent state
- 2) Articles of Confederation (A.O.C.)
  - a. First Gov. of USA
    - i. Each state had one vote in Congress
    - ii. Congress has to ASK for revenue from states
    - iii. Could direct Army/Navy
    - iv. Could declare war
    - v. Conducted foreign relations
- 3) Weaknesses of A.O.C.
  - a. No power to tax
  - b. No power to raise troops
  - c. No Executive or Judicial branch
  - d. No power to regulate interstate trade
  - e. All 13 states needed for amendments
- 4) **Problems under the A.O.C.** 
  - a. Shays' Rebellion showed true weaknesses
  - b. Call to revise the A.O.C.
- 5) Constitutional Convention
  - a. Delegates agreed to throw out A.O.C.
  - b. Agreed on need for Executive and Judicial
  - c. Virginia Plan = Population (House of Reps)
  - d. New Jersey Plan = Equal representation (Senate)
  - e. Great Compromise = Form Bicameral Congress
  - f. Electoral College chooses president.
